Highlights of 2025

In 2025, Family Service made significant strides in expanding its impact and enhancing its services.

Family Service has been a founding agency in Wisconsin's School-Based Mental Health Programing. 2025 marks 11 years this program has been helping meet the needs of schools across Waukesha County. In 2025, we expanded programing to add a new district, Addeline Montessori. We also expanded our programing in the School District of Waukesha to include community presentations for families in the district. Our programing in Oconomowoc Area School District now provides supports to high school students struggling with substance use concerns.

We were the recipients of a grant through Froedtert Menomonee Falls Hospital Community Foundation help to reduce financial barriers for older adults accessing mental health services in Northeastern Waukesha County.

We trained 10 Family Service therapists in The CAMS Framework® (CAMS). CAMS is an empirically validated treatment application of suicide-focused care. This training was made possible by The Charles E. Kubly Foundation.


We increased the reach our Center of Prevention of Family Violence Programs to two new counties: Jefferson and Dane County.

We partnered with another local non-profit the Humane Animal Welfare Society of Waukesha County, to provide mental health supports to their employees and volunteers.


